"...In the evening you shall know that it was the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, and in the morning you shall see the glory of the Lord..." (Exodus 16:6-7)

While November brings along colder weather it also brings one of my favorite holidays. Thanksgiving is a time where we gather not only to eat wonderful food but to think of all the things for which we are grateful. These days we may be finding it hard to be grateful. Many of us are disillusioned by the economy as we continue to struggle to meet our basic needs. But it's time like this where it is all the more important to be grateful. Council Meeting Notes October 18, 2011

Pastor Andy thanked us for all the enthusiasm and hard work he sees happening at Grace and is very hopeful for our future. He also asked us to be sure to let him know when anyone is in the hospital or shut in at home so he can visit them. He sees this as an important part of his call.

All members of the Council were present and reported on their activities. All of the teams were pleased with how things are going. The first Grace youth group meeting had 12 young people attend and they had a great time and asked if they could meet more often! Sunday School is off to a good start as is ALPHA and the Adult Sunday School. The properties team has completed most of their fall projects and were very appreciative of all the help with the church clean-up on October 8th, especially for the youth that came and worked so hard. Bob Ketelsen thanked WELCA for their help with funding and commended James LeJeune for the fine job he and his crew are doing at the front entrance on Broadway. The gate to close off our driveways to through traffic between Rt 173 and Broadway was delayed but will still be completed this fall. A new budget process was described which will allow the congregation to see and study the budget several weeks before the meeting at the end of January. Several new administrative committees were described to help with financial planning and reporting as well as a subcommittee to maintain the integrity of our congregation's constitution and bylaws. There will be a number of new opportunities to serve on these committees that will be announced at a later date.

The next council meeting will be held November 15th at 7:00 pm. The joint team meetings will be held November 1st at 6:30 pm. Please attend if you would like to join a team.

A lot of business was discussed at our last meeting in October since November and December are two of WELCA's busiest months—lots of activity and plenty for all to be a part of.

To fill you in on how the WELCA funds are to be distributed between now and the end of the year, we have paid \$450 toward the updated church signs on Broadway and Rt. 173 and will be paying the remainder of \$300.00 when the bill is received.

Still to be allocated is the cost of repairing the vinyl chairs in the Community Hall. At last count some 30 chairs need replacing of either the back or seat portion of the chair.

In an effort for WELCA to replenish their bank account, they are holding their annual **Holiday Bake Sale, Silent Auction and Craft Sale on Sunday, November 20th**, just in time for the Thanksgiving holiday. Once again, the **WELCA ladies would appreciate members who will bake (breads, pies, cakes, muffins, cupcakes, cookies, fudge) for the bake sale**. It's amazing how many great bakers we have among us. We are **also looking for homemade items** such as preserves and jams, handmade clothing, aprons, towel embossing or monogramming, quilts, table runners, etc. If you have a service perhaps you could donate some time or provide a gift certificate. Or, you may wish to purchase a gift certificate from a store. Our silent auction is always a lot of fun. We will have minimum bids. All of the money received from this sale will go toward needed projects in our church. We are certain that you are all aware of the ongoing improvements which have been accomplished. These improvements come from all of you through your generous time, money and efforts.

The WELCA ladies have unanimously voted to hold their annual Christmas luncheon at the Twin Oaks Country Inn in Wilmot, Wisconsin on Saturday, December 3rd from 11:30am to 2:30-3:00pm. Once again, we are putting up a sign up sheet and the first 30 ladies who pay will have a reservation. At sign up, you are requested to pay the \$18.50 which includes complete dinner, beverage, tax and gratuity. There will be three items to choose from: Grilled Breast of Chicken over a bed of Fettuccini with a light Alfredo Sauce - served with a side dish of green beans almandine; Grilled Salmon with Baked Potato; Grilled Sirloin Steak with Baked Potato. Properties Committee Report

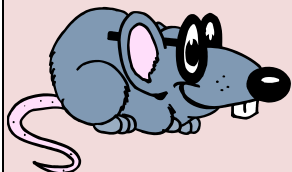
The annual Fall Cleaning Day was held on Saturday, October 8th. In addition to a number of congregation members that have supported this effort over the years, we had a great turn out of volunteers from the Alpha and Youth groups. It was so great to see so many of the youth of our church involved in this activity. Thank you to all who participated to help make our church sparkle for the fall and winter months ahead.

The second phase of our parking lot and driveway repairs which comprised of filling all of the cracks and seal coating of the entire driveway and parking were started in mid-September. Unfortunately the rain and cold weather caused major disruptions in this work. The contractor had to redo their work in many areas due to the rain, but did not charge us for the additional labor and materials involved. All work was finally completed the week of October 1st at a cost of \$5,468.72. It was paid out of the Building Growth fund. This year's repair work will hopefully buy us 4 to 5 years to build funds before we need to do any more major work. Our plan would be to start repaving large sections over time based on available funds.

Plans for installing a traffic gate to eliminate a significant contributor to the deterioration of our driveways and parking lots (the use of our church driveways as a convenient bypass between Broadway and Route 173 for local area residents and commercial vehicles) is moving forward. The gate will be located at the southwest corner of the church. In addition "GATED" signs will be added to the "PRIVATE ROAD NO THRU ACCESS signs at the Broadway and Route 173 entrances. We hope to have the gate in place in November.

The new sign boards with Pastor Andy's name were installed on the church signs on October 10th. The cost was \$400.00. WELCA graciously agreed to fund this expense. The second phase of the upgrades will be the installation of 2'x 8' panels with 4 rows of changeable letters below the Pastor's name board, which will be used to display worship and Sunday school times, planned events and other messages. The approximate cost will be \$350.00. If you would like to participate in this project or make a donation to help fund this work, please contact your Property Committee.
