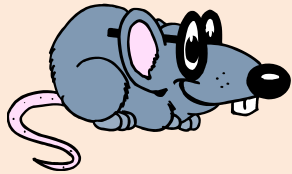

## Haiti News – The Children of Haiti Need Our Help!

Why re-invent the wheel? So at the risk of repeating myself, I'm repeating myself. We still need your help with supplies for our medical mission to Haiti October 14<sup>th</sup> - 22<sup>nd</sup>. This trip will have returning Grace Lutheran veterans such as Heather Harren, George Zimmermann, Jon Petersen and other medical people from the area heading to Haiti for a week of medical clinics. We plan to set up medical clinics in Plen Matin, Charlot and do home visits in the area. Special attention will be paid to the children in the areas. As always, we are in need of several items for this trip. Bring your donations to church, clearly marked for 'Haiti Mission' and place them in Luther Hall. Let me know so I can take inventory and store them until we pack for the trip.

### Health and Hygiene:

Vitamins (no gummy vitamins) – children's/prenatal/iron/adult

Pain relievers such as Ibuprofen, Tylenol, aspirin 81 mg, children's chewable Tylenol- age 6 to 12

Digestive aids such as DiGel, Tums, Roloids, Pepto-Bismol, Maalox

Anti fungal creams such as Monistat, Neosporin, etc.

Toothbrushes/ tooth paste / fluoride

Cough syrup, eye wash, hydrogen peroxide

Children's Pepcid AC

4 x 4 gauze, medical tape, dressing materials, Q tips

Otosopes

### Other Supplies:

Flashlights (with extra batteries)

Batteries (D) (AA) (AAA)

Plastic or metal plates - washable (for the children to eat from – we need about 500) Ziploc storage bags (gallon and quart size)

School supplies – colored pencils, paper, erasers, pencil sharpeners, protractors, etc.

School bags

Soccer balls

Collapsible water bottle

Igloo water cooler (5 or 10 gallon)

As always, we appreciate your donations, your prayers and all that you do to help expand our Haiti ministry and our children's feeding program. The funds collected at the Pig Roast will go toward the purchase of a new vehicle which is used for the delivery of the food and medicines to the villages in our children's feeding program as well as our transportation when visiting Haiti.

## Council Meeting Notes September 13, 2011

**Actions:** Several projects proposed by Bob Ketelsen's Property Committee were approved, including patching cracks and sealing the entire lot, adding a locked traffic gate to eliminate through-traffic and modifying the signs at both entrances. Read more in the Properties article in this issue.

In the interest of being able to prepare for the Council meeting regarding requests that come out of the joint committee meeting on the first Tuesday of the month, it was voted to change the Council Meeting to the THIRD Tuesday of the month beginning in October. **The next meeting of the Council will be October 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm.** The joint committee meeting will continue to meet on the first Tuesday of the month.

With the resignation of Dave Baker from the Council due to personal reasons, another Council member needed to be appointed as liaison for the Music and Worship committee. Several people had been approached but only Sue Fosdal had expressed interest in taking it on. She was elected to serve until the January Congregational meeting at which time the Congregation can vote to confirm her to complete the two-year term or elect another individual.

Pastor Andy will be attending the Northern Illinois Synod Professional Leaders' Conference September 26-28<sup>th</sup>.

## Property Report and Cleaning Day October 8th



Fall is here, which means it is time for us to get together for our annual **Church Cleaning Day**. We will be vacuuming, dusting, and polishing the sanctuary, narthex and meeting rooms and washing windows and entry doors inside and out. All cleaning supplies will be provided. Bring the whole family. Many hands make the work go faster.

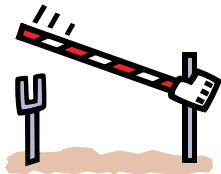
A sign-up sheet will be available in the Narthex at the welcome center. Please join us on **Saturday, October 8<sup>th</sup>** from 9:00 AM to Noon to help make our church sparkle for the fall and winter months ahead.

**Calling All Grass Cutters.** Your property committee is desperately in need of volunteers to help cut the church lawns. We have a nice big John Deere lawn tractor that's fun to drive. If you like to cut grass, we would love to have you join our team. Please contact your property committee.

All five of our inoperative furnaces were replaced in early August at total cost of \$27,670.00. The new furnaces should provide us with reliable heating and cooling for many years to come.

Pot hole patching of the worst areas in the parking lots and driveways was completed in mid-August. A compacted gravel shoulder was also added to the route 173 driveway. Thank you to WELCA and Daycare for funding this work. This patching was follow-on work to what was accomplished last year. Given the cost involved, we did the minimum amount of patching to get by this year along with adding compacted gravel to the 173 driveway shoulders. In addition to the patching, we plan to have all of the parking lot/driveway cracks filled and then seal coat the entire parking lot/driveway in September to prevent further deterioration. This will hopefully buy us 4 to 5 years to build funds before we need to do any more major work. Our plan would be to start repaving large sections over time based on available funds.

Over the years our church driveways have been used as a convenient bypass between Broadway and Route 173 for local area residents and commercial vehicles. This has been a significant contributor to the deterioration of our driveways and parking lots. "PRIVATE ROAD NO THRU TRAFFIC" signs were installed last year with the hope that would eliminate/reduce the through traffic, but they have had little



impact. To avoid further deterioration of the pavement and to protect the Daycare children from this traffic, we have decided to install a **traffic gate**. The gate will be located on the west side of the church. (The exact location is still being finalized.) Approvals have been

received from the Richmond Police and Fire Chief. We are hoping to have the gate in place before winter.

The property committee has developed a plan to update the church signs to incorporate Pastor Andy's name, the new worship and Sunday school times and also provide the capability to provide other messages. Details are still being finalized. We are hoping to have these modifications in place this fall. If you would like to help with this project, please contact your property committee.
